For much of that time, Bob also served as the official photographer and archivist for the college. In addition, he collected historical photographs of things around the Wheeling and Ohio County area. During this class, we will examine some of Bob's photographs and some photos and documents from the Nicodemus collection and will discuss the stories behind them.

Earl Nicodemus is retired after 40 years as a professor of Instructional Technology at West Liberty University. He helped to form the West Liberty Historical Society, and he and his family maintained the historic West Liberty Cemetery from 1985 to 2016. In 2016, Earl was named as a West Virginia History Hero. His other interests include gardening and fishing.

112. Historic Preservation in Downtown

Wheeling

Thursday, October 17th 2-4PM

Downtown Wheeling is experiencing a revitalization. Since 2014, the downtown vacancy rate has dropped from 32% to just 15%, with only two demolitions. Since 1982, two new buildings have been constructed downtown. Clearly, the historic building stock of Wheeling is one of the City's greatest assets. Learn about how seemingly dilapidated buildings can have a second life through historic preservation.

A Pittsburgh native, **Betsy Sweeny** earned degrees in art history and anthropology from the University of Missouri and a masters in historic preservation from the Savannah College of Art and Design. Prior to relocating to Wheeling, Betsy worked as an architectural historian at James Madison's Montpelier in Orange, Virginia. As historic preservation programs manager at Wheeling Heritage, Betsy's work includes history-related projects, facilitating technical assistance for historic building owners, and overseeing the organization's historic preservation efforts.

101 Anthony Salatino
Tuesday, September 3rd 10AM

Anthony Saltino is a 53 year old who has experienced many tragedies in his lifetime. The most proud husband to Kathi Salatino, and a father to a son named, Troy. Over the years Mr. Salatino experienced several tragedies in life that almost destroyed him. He lost his 3.5 year old daughter tragically during the holiday season in 1996, hitting bottom but leaning on his wife at the time for strength, only to have his beloved wife and his son's mother pass away unexpectedly in 2015, causing Mr. Salatino to have PTSD symptoms. He recently met his current wife Kathi, and turned his life around actually living life again, a life of hope and happiness. He owes this to his current lifestyle of plenty of sleep, meditation, good eating habits and exercise. In this session Mr. Salatino will explain how these have helped keep him off medication; helping him become the best he can be. He will discuss how this lifestyle can help one in grief or just during the everyday challenges of life.

106. Touchstone Research Laboratories (tour)

Over the past 37 years, Brian has built one of the most successful and inventive commercial research and development organizations in the United States. Under his direction, Touchstone has performed over \$100M in research and development for both the private sector and the Federal government. These efforts have generated a large volume of intellectual property in the development of new materials and products.

Brian Joseph is named on over 30 US and international patents and is recognized as a leader in R&D management. He has served on the board of the Industrial Research Institute, the country's most

prestigious R&D association and he has been the keynote speaker at multiple conferences including the Federal Laboratory Consortium's (FLC) National meeting.

Brian has received numerous awards over the years including Entrepreneur of the Year for West Virginia from Ernst and Young and the National Blue Chip Enterprise Award from the US Chamber of Commerce. As a result of his excellent leadership, Touchstone has been awarded four R&D 100 Awards from R&D Magazine for the creation of one of the most important technologies brought to market worldwide in any year. Two of the awards involve the coal-based CFOAM carbon foam technology.

After matriculating from what is now West Liberty University, Brian went on to perform graduate work in biophysics at Ohio State University. In 2015, he was conferred an honorary doctorate from West Liberty University. Brian has spun 3 businesses out of Touchstone's research business in the past three years with more spin-outs planned.

Currently, Brian serves on the boards of CFOAM, Ltd., Grow Ohio Valley, a non-profit focused on regional food security, as well as the JB Chambers Foundation -- a regional youth-oriented charitable trust.

She lives in Wheeling with her family.
