BUDGETING AN INCOME

Participants will be challenged to provide a household budget that reflects the changing needs of individuals and families.

FIELD REPORT

Discover your inner geographer by exploring the WLU campus using a drone, GPS units and a portable weather station. Learn to recognize the distinctive features of places as near as your hometown and as far as a map can take you. Become familiar with the geographical aspects of place-making, tourism, sustainability, community development and resource ecology. Professors Massey and Kruse will also discuss the career opportunities and internships available to students in the areas of Geography and Planning.

MAKING COMICS

If you enjoy comic books and graphic novels, come learn how they are created. Members from the WLU Graphic Narrative program will teach you some comic book theory. You'll also learn how to write a story for comics and how to create your own comic book layout.

INVESTIGATIVE PRACTICES

The criminal justice program will host an investigative practices event which will include faculty in the criminal justice program, local law enforcement, and recent alumni of the program. The event will introduce students to the field of criminal justice and include a hands-on demonstration of crime scene practices. Resources from various local agencies will consist of crime scene recreation as well as a specialized K-9 unit in the field.

PSYCH OUT

Students will learn about the various sub discipline areas of psychology, potential careers related to psychology, and the WLU psychology program mission and goals. Students will have the opportunity to participate in an assortment of psychology-related hands-on active learning demonstrations.

REINVENTING THE VIKINGS

Get a hands-on look at how we can interpret the activities of these intrepid seafarers. Were they raiders, traders, or explorers?
