Satisfactory Academic Progress

Something to be aware of, especially after the final exams is WLU's Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy. This is important because students need to meet SAP requirements to be eligible for Financial Aid. The requirements to be met are:

- GPA- 0-29 credit hours earned (1.6 GPA), 30-59 credit hours earned (1.8 GPA), 60+ credit hours earned (2.0 GPA)
- Complete 70% of credit hours attempted.
- Complete degree within 150% time frame
