

West Liberty University will hold its Fall 2011 Commencement Ceremony on Saturday, December 10, at 11:00 a.m. in the Academic, Sports and Recreation Complex (ASRC). Doors will open for seating at 9:30 a.m. Tickets are not required. Students should report to their designated line-up locations in the ASRC at 10:15 a.m. on December 10.

Parking will be available for guests behind the ASRC.

Christopher Cox, Triadelphia, WV, will be the graduating student speaker.

One hundred and forty-three students are expected to complete graduation requirements during the fall semester.
