

West Liberty University will air its virtual fall 2020 Commencement Ceremony on Saturday, December 5, 2020, at 11:00 a.m. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, an in seat ceremony will not be held. The ceremony will air on Topper Station and WLU social media outlets. Graduates will be invited to campus for an in seat ceremony when it is safe to do so.
